


PROBLEM

- Children from Sylheti speaking backgrounds are disconnected from their cultural heritage and mother tongue.
- They need to overcome sense of embarrassment/inhibition they feel on trying to speak in Sylheti.
- There is also lack of an effective way to teach them basic Sylheti language for everyday communication.

SOLUTION

Our programme "Exploring Sylheti Culture and Language: A Fun and Engaging Journey" aims to reconnect children aged 7 to 14 with their mother tongue and cultural heritage through interactive and traditional activities and develop a strong sense of identity to their cultural heritage.

A 24-week in-person programme that introduces children to Sylheti while also providing parents with a framework for supporting their children's learning at home.

Language


Taught through Role-playing and games, as well as traditional activities such as pottery, basket weaving, knitting, arts and crafts, traditional games, and cooking.

The curriculum emphasises speaking, listening, and pronunciation using a variety of teaching methodologies, including visuals, and authentic materials to the culture.

Summary

This programme allows children to reconnect with their cultural heritage and mother tongue, Sylheti.

Our curriculum incorporates both interactive and traditional activities to provide a solid foundation for communicating in Sylheti. We will conduct regular reviews and assessments to monitor student progress and make necessary adjustments to the curriculum and teaching methods.

The programme will also culminate in an end-of-term open evening to bring the community together to celebrate our students' achievements, learn about other initiatives from partnering bodies, and enjoy food and drink as well as entertainment.

- Develop basic speaking and listening skills
- Reconnect with cultural heritage & mother tongue
- Create stronger bond with grandparents
- Develop a strong sense of cultural identity



- Students will be able to use basic Sylheti for everyday communication
- Students will be able to understand & respond to simple questions in Sylheti
- Students will have a deeper appreciation of the culture & tradition of Sylheti

OUR LANGUAGE CURRICULUM

Week 1-2 Introduction to Sylheti Bangla

Introduce basic greetings, such as "Hello" and "Goodbye"

Teach the numbers from 1-10

Use fun and interactive activities, such as games and songs, to engage students

Week 3-6 Basic vocabulary

Teach basic vocabulary for everyday objects, such as "book," "pen," and "desk"

Introduce simple actions and verbs, such as "read," "write," and "sit"
Use flashcards, picture books, and realia to provide visual aids

Week 7-10 Basic sentence structure

Teach basic sentence structure and how to form simple sentences Introduce basic grammatical concepts, such as noun-verb agreement and sentence structure

Encourage students to practice making their own sentences using the vocabulary and grammar they have learned

Use simple sentence-building activities, such as matching subject and predicate cards

Week 11-12 Conversational skills and idiomatic expressions

Introduce basic conversation topics, such as introducing oneself and asking someone's name

Encourage students to practice having short conversations with each other

Teach idiomatic expressions and proverbs, to enrich their speaking Use role-playing activities to provide practice in context

Week 13-16 Basic grammar

Introduce basic grammatical concepts, such as noun-verb agreement and sentence structure

Practice using grammar in context through sentence building and conversation practice

Week 17-20 Vocabulary expansion

Introduce more advanced vocabulary and complex concepts

Practice using new vocabulary in context through sentence building
and conversation practice

Week 21-24 Review and assessment

Review the material covered throughout the course Assess student progress through speaking and listening activities

Weekly Planner

Monday

20 new words with pictures. Review new words with flashcards and have students repeat them.

Tuesday

To practise new words, play Hangman, Word Scramble, or Word Search.

Wednesday

Students can write new words and use them in sentences in vocabulary journals. Inspire them to draw their sentences.

Thursday

Students play a vocabulary matching game, where they match the new words with their corresponding pictures or translations.

Friday

Vocabulary quiz to assess student understanding and retention of the new words.

It's crucial to practise daily, not just in class. Encourage your child to speak and listen with the new words.

Flashcards can help them review new words. Songs, rhymes, and other mnemonics can make learning fun and memorable.


